Not illustrated. 1864 Excerpt: . . . than in man; its innermost division, equal in size to one-third of the whole, diverging abruptly from the rest of the muscle, sent its tendon along the metatarsal of the great toe, parallel with the tendon of the last-named muscle, to be attached to the base of the second or terminal phalange of that toe; its external division gave a tendon to each of the four outer toes. Each toe, then, in the Chimpanzee, has at least a long and a short extensor for its phalanges, whilst the great toe has two additional extensors, one for its metatarsal, and another for its cuneiform bone, to ensure free and varied mobility in opening the foot; the fifth toe has one additional extensor, as in man, namely, the peroneus brevis. Of the four extensors of the great toe, the two innermost seem to represent the tibialis anticus...
